Tips for sharing Rhythmix PAL multi-cultural arts education assemblies with your students

We suggest several ways for teachers to incorporate the virtual PAL program in their class curriculum:

- **1.** Review the Study Guide and Study Slides with your class and have a discussion about your students' expectations and prior knowledge before watching the performance video.
- **2.** Watch the PAL video with your class. Control play/stop options for your entire class to engage students during the performance with questions and discussions from the Study Guide.
- **3.** Following the assembly video, lead your class through one of the Study Guide activities to reinforce their viewing.
- **4.** Watch the short PAL Artist SEL video with your class. Control play/stop options for your entire class to engage students with the SEL-aligned questions and reflections included in the video.
- **5.** Following the Artist SEL video, lead your class through one of the suggested SEL activities to deepen their connection with the performance, culture, their classmates and themselves.
- **6.** View the AEF visual arts resource videos together in class and assign the art projects as independent work. Share your students' projects with us by emailing photos to pal@rhythmix.org.
- **7.** Send any PAL related art/writing projects or thank you letters to pal@rhythmix org. RCW shares select student work with our funders to help secure future grants for PAL.
